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A Message from the Director

With warm temperatures, sunny days and the final schoolwork turned in, it feels like summer is here. At the Findlay-Hancock County Public Library, that means it's time for SummerREAD.

Our SummerREAD team started planning for this year's program long before COVID-19 was part of our everyday vocabulary. The fantasy and fairy tale themed "Imagine Your Story", provided by the Collaborative Summer Library Program, had our staff dreaming of dragons flying through the skylight and magical forest animals dancing through the stacks.

While those plans have adapted to our current circumstances, what remains true is the importance of reading during the summer. The summer slide isn't a piece of roped off playground equipment. It's the very real concept that over the summer, kids lose significant knowledge gained during the school year. One study found that loss in reading skills can be, on average, 20% of the gains made over the academic year. Cumulatively, this can have a very serious impact on a child's future success. Further, while our local educators did a tremendous job of shifting to virtual learning for the last several months, the unusual end to the school year has the potential to make the summer slide a bit steeper this year. The library is here to help slow the descent.

This summer, I encourage you to give your kids the freedom to read what they want. AR levels, Lexile scores and word counts all have their place in educational settings. Not one of those factored into my childhood summers filled with Nancy Drew, The Babysitter's Club and every book L.M. Montgomery ever wrote. With a quick call to the library, our Children's Services staff can find a stack of fun new choices for your family based on what your child likes to read and have them ready for curbside pickup.

Adults, give yourself that same freedom. Our days have been filled with news reports, science, and politics. Why not take a break with your version of a beach read instead? The Thursday Lunchtime Book Recommendations on our Facebook page can give you some great ideas to start. Or, check out the Personalized Librarian service and have a library staff member pull items specially selected based on your reading tastes. All ages can track your reading through our Virtual SummerREAD program on READSquared, unlocking new features as you go.

At our house, summer reading kicked off with a quiet weekend on the patio. I enjoyed a paperback while my daughter listened to an audiobook as she watched the clouds drift by. While we might not get to see that dragon flying in the library, with a stack of good books we'll still have lots to imagine as the summer stretches on.




How To Participate




Register for the Program

Go to <http://findlaylibrary.readsquared.com> and click 'Register' at the top right. If you want to register just yourself, click "Myself" or if you'd like to register your children also, click 'Myself and Children', then follow the prompts. Be sure to create the adult account first, and then add children to your account. This gives you access to all of the children's information and you'll be able to log all of your family's reading on one screen.




Logging Minutes


On the left side of the dashboard, under Family Members, you can choose the person you wish to log activity for. To enter the minutes that you've read, click "enter Activity' from your dashboard and then click "Minutes' and enter your information. For those managing multiple account, you can enter minutes for the whole family. If you're entering for just one person, make sure you uncheck other names. Submit, and you've done it!



Missions

Missions are extra challenges that give you the opportunity to earn badges, points and other special rewards. Click the 'Missions' tab to see a description on the challenges and choose what you'd like to do. Click 'Go To Mission' to complete the activities. Be sure to read instructions for Missions carefully so that you can earn your badges.







Games and Game Board

Pass along the benefit of your knowledge and give us a book review! Select "Logging" and click on Review Book. Let us know what you think about what you're reading!




Events

What is Hoopla Digital?

Hoopla Digital is a digital streaming service for library users to access free eBooks, eAudiobooks, music, movies, and TV shows using portable devices like smartphones and tablets.

What do I need?

Tablet, smartphone, computer, or TV with streaming capabilities

E-mail address and password

Library card number (only needed one time in the registration process)

Hoopla Digital app or updated browser software (e.g. Chrome, Firefox, IE, Safari, etc.)

Step 1: Register for a free Hoopla Digital account.

Go to hoopladigital.com and click on the blue **Get Started** button. (You may also use the free Hoopla Digital app to register. The registration process is similar.)

Step 2: Enter your information.

Enter your e-mail address and create a new password. Review Hoopla Digital's terms and conditions and click on the **Agree** button. Once your account is verified, you will need this e-mail address and password to sign into Hoopla Digital.

Step 3: Choose Findlay Hancock County Public Library.

Findlay-Hancock County Public Library may appear in the list of nearby libraries. If it doesn't appear in the list, type it in the search box.

Click on the **Next** button to continue registering.

Step 4: Enter your FHCPL card number.

Type your 14-digit library card number - without spaces - in the box.

Click on the **Sign Me Up** button. **NOTE:** If your library card number ever changes, you will need to update your Hoopla Digital account at Settings > Library > Library Card Number.






The One and Only Bob Katherine Applegate


Summer Song Kevin Henkes




What About Worms!? Ryan T. Higgins


Gretel and Hansel







The Glass Magician Caroline Stevermer



The Edge of Anything Nora Shalaway Carpenter







The Sea Glass Cottage RaeAnne Thayne




The Baja California Cookbook David Castro Hussong


Lunch with Lucy Sherry Stewart Deutschmann


