TeenTober is a nationwide celebration hosted by libraries every October that aims to celebrate teens, promote year-round teen services that help teens learn new skills, and fuel their passions in and outside the library. TeenTober replaces YALSA's previous Teen Read Week™ and Teen Tech Week™ celebrations. Because of the current situation, the celebration will be a little different this year. Since we can't get together for programs, Miss Erin will be hosting Virtual Teen Bingo on October 13 from 6-7 pm on Zoom to celebrate our teens.

course books for high schoolers to tackle those tough classes? We also have ACT prep books and an online database for help with homework! When you're done with your schoolwork, there's fun to be had. - 15 minutes before the discussion, click the link and you'll be entered into the video chat.




Discussion Series
